## Returning to School in September 2020

Firstly, I hope you and those dear to you are all well. We have two more weeks of the Summer Term left, and naturally we are looking forward to September when all of the children should be back in school. Of course, this is based upon there not being either a local or a national lockdown again.

The Government have issued lots of guidance over the last few months regarding operating schools safely. It seems that with the latest guidance many of the measures that were in place to minimise risk have been taken away; as this is possibly the only way that schools can function more normally.

For example, the 2-metre rule / advice is no longer applicable in schools, unless you are the teacher. There is an aspirational or ideal size for a pupil 'bubble' which is now 30, not 15 pupils. Other measures that we will consider include:

- avoiding contact between these 'bubbles' during the school day
- separate starting, finishing, lunch and break times
- regular cleaning of hands
- no big group events like school assemblies, fetes, or school productions
- arranging our classrooms with forward facing desks, wherever possible

Wherever possible we want the return to school to be as normal as possible, but we will not compromise the safety of staff and pupils and their families.

### Symptoms

If your child is poorly in school, we shall be expecting you to make arrangements to pick them up from school in a reasonable time. This has always been the case. The latest guidance we have regarding COVID-19 symptoms is similar as to before. We will isolate your child safely with a member of staff.

### Start and Finish Times

Unfortunately, we will not be allowing parents on the school site at the start and end of the school day. We will be asking parents and carers to wait outside of the playground gates at the start and

end of the school day. Please maintain social distancing outside the gates at all times. Please do not use the main entrance by the office as a waiting place. Your designated drop off time will accompany this letter.

### **Uniform**

It is our expectation that children should wear uniform as normal, in September. However, it is also my expectation that pupils are dressed in fresh clean clothes daily. As a parent myself I know that this is not always possible. Currently the children in school wear clean and 'sensible' clothes to school, when they do not have clean uniform.

### **PE Kit**

The children will not be required to change for PE, as is the case currently. On the day that your child has PE, they may wear their PE Kit to school. We will let you know which days these are in September. During the colder months this will include jogging bottoms and a warm top, suitable for exercising in.

### **Reading Books and Homework**

We are developing a system in which reading books and homework materials will be sent to and from school safely. There will not be an expectation that reading books are brought in every day, but of course there will be an expectation that you continue to read with the selection of books that we distribute on a weekly basis.

### **Flexible Approach**

At all times, both before and after we went into 'lockdown' we have, as a staff, tried to be as accommodating and adapt to either a family's needs, or that of individual children. If we find that one or some of our approaches do not seem to be working, we may have to change them swiftly. I will of course try and give you as much notice as possible.


### **Finally**
